CONFIRMED NESTING OF BLACK-BELLIED WHISTLING-DUCKS IN WEAKLEY COUNTY, TENNESSEE

A pair of Black-bellied Whistling-Ducks (*Dendrocygna autumnalis*) successfully nested in 2022 on a beef cattle farm located approximately 6 km southwest of Martin, Weakley County, Tennessee. On 10 September 2022, D. Michael Pierce, manager of the Freeman Cattle Farm, told me about 13 Black-bellied Whistling-Ducks (two adults and 11 young) that he and other farm employees had been observing daily on a small stockpond on the farm. Later that day I visited the pond and observed 12 Black-bellied Whistling-Ducks (two adults and 10 young). I estimated that the immature ducks, which did not fly, were about 50% as large as the adults.

I made six additional visits to the pond. On 17 September, I photographed two adults and 10 young (Figure 1). On 22 September I observed two adults and nine young. On 28 September I observed two adults and nine young.

tember, no ducks were present on the pond when I arrived, but two adults and nine young flew to the pond and landed. This was the first time I observed the young ducks in flight. On 29 September no ducks were present when I arrived at the pond, but while I waited 11 Black-bellied Whistling-Ducks flew over the pond and continued to another small pond approximately 600 m away. This was my last observation of the ducks. On my 04 October visit and my 08 October visit to the pond I did not see any ducks.

Using Google Earth Pro[©], I determined that the pond was located at 36°16'52.53" N 88°54'32.25" W. I estimated (with Google Earth Pro[©]) the filled pond would be close to 65 m in diameter with a surface area of about 0.4 ha (1 acre). Due to infrequent rainfall during September, the water level of the pond dropped, leaving a barren ring of soil between the pond and the pasture. On my last visit to the pond, on 08 October, the surface area of water had declined by roughly 50%, and mud flats surrounded the shallow pools of remaining water. Other than two Black Willow (*Salix nigra*) trees on the pond levee, no aquatic plants were present either in the pond or around the pond margins. Cattle pasture surrounding the pond primarily contained Tall Fescue (*Schedonorus arundinaceus*), clover (*Trifolium* sp.), and Bermuda-Grass (*Cynodon dactylon*).

Black-bellied Whistling-Ducks nest primarily in tree cavities (or nest boxes), but they will nest on the ground (Bolen 1967). The willow trees on the pond levee were smaller than 15 cm in diameter and did not contain any cavities that were large enough to serve as a nest site for ducks. My cursory search of the pasture near the pond produced no evidence of a nest. The nearest woodland was approximately 250 m from the pond. Black-bellied Whistling-Duck nest sites, whether in trees or on the ground, are frequently more than 500 m (and may occasionally be more than 1,000 m) from the nearest body of water (Delnicki and Bolen 1975). Without any clues about the exact location of the nest, I concluded that it had probably been located within a circle centered on the rearing pond and having a radius of 500 m.

Juvenile Black-bellied Whistling-Ducks typically become capable of sustained flight when they are about 60 days old (Cain 1968 as cited in Baldassarre 2014). If the young were 60 days old on 28 September (the first day I observed them in flight), their hatch date would have been approximately 30 July, which was also the first day that Freeman Cattle Farm employees D. M. Pierce and L. J. Taylor observed Black-bellied Whistling-Duck ducklings on the rearing pond. Assuming a 28-day incubation period (Bolen 1967), 13 days for egg laying (based on an average clutch size of 13 eggs laid one per day [Bolen 1967]), and initiation of incubation on the day the 11th egg was laid (Delninki 1973), the first egg would have been laid close to 21 June, a date that occurs within the time span of mid-May to late August when Black-bellied Whistling-Ducks nesting in Texas lay most of their eggs (Bolen 1967).

This is apparently the first documented record of Black-bellied Whistling-Ducks nesting in Weakley County. Other Tennessee counties in which they are known to have nested are Lake and Obion (Pitts 1982), Shelby (Preston 2008), and Gibson (Preston 2017).

THE 2022 TENNESSEE CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNT SUMMARY

Ron Hoff Loudon, Tennessee 37774

The 2022 Tennessee Christmas Bird Count (CBC) was the 79th consecutive compilation of CBCs in Tennessee (begun in 1930), and the 92nd overall (no count was reported for 1943). Twenty-nine counts reported data this season. This year 546 observers recorded 160 species, plus 20 count week species. The weather across the state was normal for the season, but there were strong winds on the Norris count. Temperatures ranged from a frigid 15° in Shady Valley/Mountain City to a comfortable 71° in Jackson.

An Anhinga on the Duck River count and a Townsend's Solitaire on the Perry County count were both new species for the state CBC compilation, bringing the overall total species on the Tennessee CBC compilation to 280 (+ 3 count week). Neotropic Cormorant, Golden Eagle, Burrowing Owl, Northern Rough-winged Swallow, Swainson's Thrush, Red Crossbill, American Tree Sparrow, Spotted Towhee, and Dickcissel were also notable highlights.

The following species were observed in record or unusually high numbers for this compilation: Common Merganser, Lesser Black-backed Gull, Forster's Tern, Double-crested Cormorant, Bald Eagle, Northern Saw-whet Owl, Fish Crow, and Brown Creeper. Record low or notably low totals were recorded for Mourning Dove, Great Blue Heron, Loggerhead Shrike, Field Sparrow, and Song Sparrow.

BENTON - BENT (35.20069, -84.61837) – 27 December; no times reported. Weather: partly cloudy; 24-48° F. Count highlights included Merlin, Loggerhead Shrike, and American Pipit. Observers: Mathan Beachy and Nelson Troyer. Non-participating compilers were Jamin Beachy and Ruben Stoll.

BIG SANDY – BGSA (36.34050, -88.08210) - 15 December; no times reported. Weather: partly cloudy/cloudy; 30-40° F. Highlights included Surf Scoter, 25 Lesser Black-backed Gulls (new state high count), Northern Saw-whet Owl, Lapland Longspur, Le Conte's Sparrow, and Spotted Towhee. the most Loggerhead Shrikes of any Tennessee CBC. Other sightings of note included Ross's Goose, Red-breasted Nuthatch, and Palm Warbler. The total for American White Pelican was a new high count for Hamilton County. The total for Orange-crowned Warbler was a new high count for Tennessee. 

THE WINTER SEASON

Hello, and welcome to the new Season report. As you all know, Rick Knight stepped down from his duties as editor of this article after 25 years of exceptional service, providing this invaluable data and analysis to TOS members and for the permanent, published records for future generations of researchers, academics, and amateur enthusiasts alike. Earlier this year, I agreed to take on the role of Editor of The Season reports - I hope you'll all bear with me as I try to fill Rick's formidable shoes!

Over the coming months, there will likely be some changes to the format of this report. This may involve more streamlined species reports, which highlight only the more exceptional or noteworthy seasonal records. In the age of eBird's monolithic presence, it has become less important for this report to compile easily accessed data such as first-of-season reports of expected waterfowl species (unless exceptional), and, more important, to try to provide context for those more noteworthy records. I genuinely welcome feedback via email from readers as we move forward together.

This report has historically relied on sub-regional compilers (listed below each section) who maintain and provide notable records from each region. We are currently in need of someone interested in compiling data from the Eastern Mountain Region. Please email the editor if you would like to contribute from that area. Sightings are also taken from reports to tnbirds.org extracted from eBird, and to a lesser extent from verifiable social media reports. Although the editor makes every attempt to confirm these records, inclusion in this report does not imply that a record has been submitted to, or accepted by, the Tennessee Bird Records Committee (TBRC), or included in the official list of Birds of Tennessee. Decisions relevant to the official Tennessee list are made by the TBRC and are reported periodically here in *The Migrant*. -GG

Average temperatures this winter were much above average across the state, and indeed the entire eastern United States. This was despite record breaking and near record breaking lows set in December by a historic winter storm which barreled into the region as a "bomb cyclone" occurrence. This is defined by meteorologists as an extreme drop in atmospheric pressure in a 24-hour period (the defining pressure drop required for this label is latitude dependent). Precipitation statewide was above average. One apparent result of the winter storm was an influx of higher than usual numbers of Lapland Longspurs in middle and east Tennessee, with new high-count records set for at least three counties. Higher than average numbers of American Pipits were also reported.

Boreal irruptive species were nearly absent this winter, with below average numbers of

Purple Finches and virtually no Pine Siskins outside of the far eastern mountains throughout the state. Red-breasted Nuthatches were also relatively scarce. An anticipated southerly march of Evening Grosbeaks this year stopped well short of Tennessee, with only three locations reporting birds at feeders, all in the eastern foothills. A good diversity of uncommon and rare gulls and raptors were found in west Tennessee, with a rare Ferruginous Hawk which stayed the winter. One Western and several Red-necked Grebes were found. Notable rare passerines include Smith's Longspur, Black-headed Grosbeak, Spotted Towhee, and Townsend's Solitaire.

WESTERN COASTAL PLAIN REGION - - Temperatures in late December to early January were well below average, with another dip below average temperatures in early February. Overall, however, temperatures were on average higher than normal, as elsewhere across the state. Snow and icefall were associated with the January and February drops. Notable rarities included a juvenile Ferruginous Hawk continuing from fall (9 Nov) until 30 Jan, as well as Northern Saw-whet Owl, Black-legged Kittiwake, Little Gull, Black-headed Grosbeak, and a wintering Spotted Towhee. A remarkable observation of two rare Smith's Longspurs in a flock of Lapland Longspurs was made in Shelby County. The two species are not known to associate on wintering grounds. The Benton County Landfill in Camden produced a California Gull, Iceland Gull, and a new state high count of 44 Lesser Black-backed Gulls. Also noteworthy are a Loggerhead Shrike in Shelby County, where that species has become increasingly rare, and a Purple Martin on 16 January which set a new early record for the state by nearly two full weeks. At the far eastern edge of the region, an Anhinga in the mouth of the Duck River in Benton County signifies a second winter record for the state.

HIGHLAND RIM AND BASIN REGION - - Both temperatures and precipitation were above average overall, despite December's winter storm sending Nashville temperatures below 0°F for the first time in 26 years. That "bomb cyclone" triggered an influx of high numbers of Lapland Longspurs and American Pipits, with many reports. It was a good winter for loons and grebes, with multiple Pacific and Red-throated Loons on the area lakes, a good showing of Eared Grebes all winter in the greater Nashville area, and Red-necked Grebes found in both Humphreys and Davidson Counties - the latter being the first county record in more than 40 years. An Iceland Gull (Thayer's) was found at Pickwick Dam in Hardin County. A winter record of Neotropic Cormorant is certainly noteworthy. An apparently wild Tundra Swan joined a known captive Trumpeter on Joe Tillet Lake in Bedford County in late December, though because captive birds are kept there, it should be considered provisional. With a count of four Fish Crows at Nashville's Shelby Bottoms Park, this isolated cluster is producing the highest reliable numbers of the rapidly expanding corvid in the mid-state.

Northern Saw-whet Owls were reported in two counties this winter. While this cryptic species has been encountered in middle Tennessee in the past, it has usually been from a

capture in a bander's net - and in the fall. Finding birds in winter is good confirmation of what is widely expected – they are out there; they are just difficult to locate. Keeping on the owl front, a Burrowing Owl over-wintered at the highly restricted TVA New Johnsonville site in Humphreys County for at least the third consecutive winter, now giving Tennessee its first, second, and third state records.

The rarity highlight of the region was a Townsend's Solitaire which kindly stuck around for several weeks, granting a state lifer for a great many birders.

EASTERN MOUNTAIN REGION – It was a rather mild winter, except for a 3-day bitter cold snap at Christmas (3 nights of single digit lows and 3 days with highs in teens or low 20s). All three scoter species were reported, as well as a pair of Long-tailed Ducks and Red-necked Grebe on either end of winter. An American Bittern and 13 Virginia Rails were reported in Greene County, the latter of which ties the second highest winter record for the state. Evening Grosbeak in three locations were the only winter records for the state this year.

INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

The Migrant records observations and studies of birds in Tennessee and adjacent areas. SUBMISSIONS: The manuscript should be submitted electronically to Bob Ford at editorthemigrant@gmail.com. Submission of hard copies is optional. If so desired the original and two copies of the manuscript should be sent to the: Editor: Bob Ford, 808 Hatchie, Brownsville, TN 38012. Manuscripts that have been published in other journals should not be submitted.

MATERIAL: The subject matter should relate to some phase of Tennessee ornithology. It should be original, factual, concise and scientifically accurate.

STYLE: Both articles and short notes are solicited; recent issues of *The Migrant* should be used as a guide in the preparation of manuscripts. Where more detail is needed, reference should be made to *Scientific Style and Format*, eighth edition, by the Council of Science Editors, councilscienceeditors.org.

COPY: Manuscripts should be double-spaced with adequate margins for editorial notations and emailed in Word.docx. Tables and figures should be prepared in a separate file with appropriate headings; see *Scientific Style and Format* for examples of appropriate form for tables. Photographs intended for reproduction should be at least 300 dpi or sharp with good contrast on glossy white paper. Weights, measurements, and distances should be in metric units. Dates should be in "continental" form (e.g., 16 March 1997). Use the 24-hour clock (e.g., 0500 or 1900).

NOMENCLATURE: The scientific name of a species should be given after the first use of the full common name in the text. The scientific name should be italicized and in parentheses. Names should follow the *A. O. U. Check-list of North American Birds* (seventh edition, 1998, or supplements).

TITLE: The title should be concise, specific and descriptive.

ABSTRACT: Manuscripts of five or more pages should include an abstract. The abstract should be less then 5% of the length of the manuscript. It should include a brief explanation of why the research was done, the major results, and why the results are important.

LITERATURE CITED: List all literature citations in a "Literature Cited" section at the end of the text. Text citations should include the author and year.

IDENTIFICATION: Manuscripts including reports of rare or unusual species or of species at atypical times should include: date and time, light and weather conditions, exact location, habitat, optical equipment, distance, behavior of bird, comparison with other similar species, characteristic markings, experience of observer, other observers verifying the identification and reference works consulted.

REPRINTS: Reprints are available to authors on request. Billing to authors will be through the TOS treasurer. Request for reprints must be made well in advance of printing.

SEASON REPORTS: Observations that are to be considered for publication in "The Season" should be mailed to the appropriate Regional Compiler. Consult a recent issue of *The Migrant* for the name and address of the compiler.
