

The 51st consecutive Elizabethton Fall Count was held on 26 September 2020 with 48 observers in 18 parties. We were dispersed more than normal due to social-distancing protocols.

The area covered was Carter Co, plus parts of adjacent Johnson, Sullivan, Unicoi, and Washington Cos.

132 species were tallied, which is above the recent 30-year average of 125 species. The all-time high on this count was 137 species set in 1993.
