Results of the Western Washington County Field Trip January 27, 2024

A total of 12 birders from the Lee and Lois Herndon Chapter of the Tennessee Ornithological Society participated in a field trip to Western Washington Count, Tennessee on January 27, 2024. It was cloudy with periods of drizzle and rain with temperatures ranging from 48-54 degrees. We met at the Ingle's in Jonesborough at 8:00am and traveled Kyker Road, Saylor Hill Road, Crestview Road, Keebler Road and finished at the Westview Ponds. A total of 40 species were observed including Northern Harrier, Red-headed Woodpecker, Bald Eagle, Loggerhead Shrike, and Eurasian Collared Dove. Here is the list of species identified.
