The 31st Carter Co. Summer Count was held on 1 June 2024 with 23 observers in 9 parties. The weather was generally favorable, but somewhat cool early in the morning and breezy at times.

We tallied 114 species, which is exactly the 30 year average, but slightly below the average of the last decade of 117 species. The all-time high was 123 species in 2017.
