Results of the August Herndon Field Trip

August 24, 2024

A total of 17 birders participated in the Lee and Lois Herndon Chapter of the Tennessee Ornithological Society field trip in Washington and Greene Counties, Tennessee on August 24, 2024. The day was mostly sunny with just a few clouds and temperatures ranging from 56-82 degrees. Winds were less than 5 miles per hour. We met at the Food City on South Roan Street in Johnson City at 8am. We birded in the parking lot before heading to Dry Creek Road between Buffalo and Cherokee Mountain. We made a couple of stops along Dry Creek Road and then traveled to AJ Willis Road before reaching Charlie Carson Road in hopes of seeing the kites. Did they put on a show! For 45 minutes, the group watched one Swallow-tailed kite and 11 Mississippi Kites feed, dive, soar and chase one another. It was incredible to watch. The group then traveled to the Black Tern Pond on Mae McKee Road and West View pond in search of shorebirds with little success. We had a wonderful lunch at the Mountain View Restaurant before returning to Food City around 3pm. A total of 47 species were observed including great looks at Mississippi Kites and Swallow-tailed Kite. Other notable species include Rose-breasted Grosbeak, Black-throated Blue Warbler, Red-shouldered Hawk, Wild Turkey, and Eastern Wood Pewee. Here is the list of species submitted to Ebird.
