The Elizabethton Fall Bird Count traditionally covers parts of five counties in northeast Tennessee, namely Carter, Johnson, Sullivan, Unicoi, & Damp; Washington.

However, this year the remnants of Hurricane Helene threw a monkey wrench into our plans, to put it mildly. Parts of the 3 mountain counties plus southern Washington Co suffered major storm damage. Flooding was devastating in these areas. Thousands of trees were toppled. Not to mention the human misery & toss of life.

Despite all this, we decided to conduct a limited count to continue our tradition. Obviously, some areas normally covered were inaccessible due to damage or recovery efforts.

We delayed the count a week from the scheduled date of Sep.28 to Oct 5. Nearly normal count coverage in Sullivan & Delayer Washington Cos was possible. Small parts of the other 3 counties were covered, with 27 observers participating.

Despite all of the limitations we tallied 124 species, which is exactly the average of the most recent 30 years of this count. Rather amazing, in my opinion. It speaks to the dedication of club members.

Highlights of the count included 2 Am. White Pelicans and a Lark Sparrow. Also notable were Semipalmated Plover, Fish Crow, & Dipit.
