The 32nd annual Carter County Summer Bird Count was held June 7 with 20 observers in 9 parties. We tallied 117 species, which is slightly above the average of 114 species.

Most unusual was a Mississippi Kite seen in the Toll Branch vicinity. Also notable were Com. Merganser and Red Crossbill.
