

If you have any questions about our field trips or if you would be interested in leading a field trip at some point in the future please let me know.



Red-Cockaded Woodpecker to be reintroduced in TN

"The Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency (TWRA), in partnership with the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) and the United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) has announced a plan to reintroduce the Red-cockaded Woodpecker (RCW), a species extirpated from Tennessee in 1994." (quoted from TWRA website)

The announcement was made at the inaugural Tennessee Biodiversity Summit held in Murfreesboro, TN on October 22 and included a message from Governor Bill Lee. The reintroduction is planned to take place in 2028 on a 1200 acre tract at Savage Gulf State Natural Area that was initially set aside to protect the white fringeless orchid. The scope of the project was expanded to include red-cockaded woodpeckers when they realized the site contained mature short-leaf pine habitat that could support the species.




