

## Results of the Western Washington County Field Trip

January 17, 2026

A total of 3 birders from the Lee and Lois Herndon Chapter of the Tennessee Ornithological Society participated in a field trip to Western Washington Count, Tennessee on January 17, 2026. We started out in the rain which ended by 9:30. The skies gradually cleared and we had sunny skies by noon time. Temperatures ranged from 35-45 degrees and winds were 5-15 mph. We met at the Ingle's in Jonesborough at 8:30am and traveled Bob Crookshanks Road, Kyker Road, Saylor Hill Road, Crestview Road, Keebler Road and finished at the Westview Ponds. We also enjoyed lunch at the Mountain View Restaurant before returning home. We were unable to bird Henderson Marsh as several hunters and their dogs were present. A total of 52 species were observed including Peregrine Falcon, Northern House Wren, Red-headed Woodpecker, Eurasian Collared Dove, Fox sparrow, and Northern Harrier. Here is the list of species identified. Numbers are from the ebird report. These numbers may vary for each observer.
